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NEWS

Gold has recently seen **heightened volatility after reaching all-time highs**, with prices pulling back sharply from extended peaks. Reports show that XAU/USD experienced a significant sell-off, with gold dropping nearly **8–10% in a short period**, wiping out a considerable amount of market value as traders booked profits and technical indicators signaled overbought conditions. This sharp correction is one of the most aggressive moves seen in the metals complex, reflecting mixed sentiment and active repositioning by traders after extended gains earlier in the year.

Despite the recent pullback, broader structural support for gold remains intact over the medium term, with markets still watching for macroeconomic drivers such as expectations of future interest rate cuts and safe-haven demand from global uncertainties. Some analyses suggest that while short-term selling pressure persists, gold could stabilize around key support levels if the US dollar weakens and global economic concerns persist. Additionally, regulatory developments like new measures on gold trading in markets such as Thailand highlight ongoing efforts to manage volatility in precious metals markets.

The **silver market has been extremely volatile recently**, with prices initially soaring to record levels above **\$120 per ounce** amid strong bullish momentum, safe-haven demand, and expectations of continued dovish monetary policy. Analysts—including Citi—had even projected silver could rally toward **\$150** as investors piled into precious metals in response to macro uncertainty and geopolitical tension earlier this month.

However, this surge **came to a dramatic halt** as profit-taking intensified and broader market factors shifted. In the latest trading sessions, XAG/USD **crashed sharply**, sliding well below \$100 after touching highs, marking one of the most significant single-day declines in years as forced liquidation, a stronger U.S. dollar, and changing investor sentiment weighed heavily on prices. Market observers have described this pullback as part of a broader correction following the historic rally, with volatility spikes raising questions about whether silver's bullish trend will resume or transition into a deeper consolidation.

WTI crude oil has been trading with strong volatility recently, driven largely by **geopolitical tensions in the Middle East**, especially around Iran. Fears of potential military action and supply disruptions have pushed prices up, with WTI climbing toward multi-month highs near the mid-\$60s as markets price in elevated risk premiums. OPEC+ has also played a role by indicating a pause in production increases for early 2026, which supports price stability and prevents deeper inventory builds, helping underpin crude prices despite weaker demand pressures.

However, analysts emphasize that **broader market fundamentals remain mixed**, with forecasts pointing to a **persistent supply surplus that could keep oil prices range-bound or even under pressure for much of 2026**. A Reuters poll of energy economists suggests that oversupply may outweigh geopolitical risks, keeping WTI averages near the \$60 level through the year. Meanwhile, global inventories continue to build, and demand growth in major regions like Asia is described as sluggish, tempering long-term bullishness despite short-term geopolitical support.

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TECHNICAL TIPS



XAUUSD:

Gold was rejected a few pips shy of the \$5,600 area on Thursday and is forming an impulsive bearish candle in the daily chart on Friday, which, if confirmed, will complete an "Evening Star" candle pattern, a signal that often announces a trend shift.

The 4-hour chart shows prices moving at a short distance from the \$5,000 level, with technical indicators trending lower. The Moving Average Convergence Divergence (MACD) line shows a sharp cross below the Signal line and a widening negative histogram, and the Relative Strength Index (RSI) prints at 43.76 (neutral below the midline), reinforcing the bearish momentum.

A confirmation below \$5,000 and the January 26 low, at \$4,980, would bring the 100-period SMA, now at \$4,822, and the January 21 low, near \$4,755, to the focus. On the upside, the intra-day high, at \$5,450, is likely to close the path towards the all-time highs, at \$5,595, hit on Thursday.

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CRUDE OIL WTI- WTI is showing **bullish momentum** intraday as prices hold above the key \$65.00 pivot area, consolidating near recent highs. The commodity has **broken above important moving averages** and **reclaimed key technical levels**, which supports the short-term bullish structure. Geopolitical tensions (especially US-Iran concerns) and a softer U.S. dollar have been adding further upside pressure on crude prices.

- **Immediate support: \$64.00–\$64.20** — important near-term buying zone.
- **Key support below: \$63.00 / \$62.00** — stronger demand zones if selling intensifies.
- **Immediate resistance: \$65.80–\$66.20** — supply zone where price may face selling pressure.
- **Extended upside: A break above \$66.20–\$66.80** could open the way toward **\$68.00+** on continuation.

📊 Intraday Bias & Strategy

Overall, the **intraday trend is bullish** as long as crude stays above **\$64.00–\$63.00** supports. Buy-on-dips strategies near these support zones can work well, targeting the upper resistance zone around **\$65.80–\$66.20**. Conversely, a clear break below **\$63.00** may shift momentum to the downside and invite deeper corrective selling
